Captain Frederick John Slatts, Commanding Officer of the U. S. Coast Guard Recruit Training Center, Cape May, New Jersey, was born 21 November 1911, in Huntington, Indiana.

He graduated from the U. S. Coast Guard Academy at New London, Connecticut, in 1936 with a Bachelor of Science Degree and served aboard various Coast Guard cutters until after the start of World War II.

During the war, he served as Commanding Officer of USS INTENSITY and USS BANGOR.

Captain Slatts was promoted to his present rank in 1958 subsequent to which he served for 2½ years as section commander of the U. S. Coast Guard Mediterranean Section, in Naples, Italy.

Among Captain Slatts' decorations are the American Defense Ribbon with Star, American Area Ribbon, European Area Ribbon with three Stars, and the World War II Victory medal.
