TRAILER UNITS NO. 4 AND NO. 7

In August of 1942 there arrived at a Coast Guard Company at the Naval Receiving Station on Terminal Island a Chrysler pump. Six Coast Guardsmen were selected to man this new contraption. The six selectees were: Hambleton, Smith, Wagner, Segalas--all green recruits, and Oldham, a veteran of the Bakersfield City Fire Department. Under the tutoring and guiding hand of Scott Oldham, the group was molded into an efficient fire-fighting unit, was soon attached to the Fire Division as Trailer Unit No. 4. On January 2, 1943, TU-4 got its baptism of fire at the huge cannery fire in Fish Harbor, earned the respect of seasoned firemen they helped battle the blaze. Now combined with TU-7, which was organized in April, 1944, and transferred to Terminal Island in May of that year, TU-4 was for many months the only piece of Coast Guard fire equipment on the Island.
