Starting quite inauspiciously as a four-page mimeograph paper on 7 February, 1941, the "Weekly Log" was not only the oldest Coast Guard publication in existence during the war, but also had the distinct reputation of being the only one which was published every week.

With a two-fold purpose of maintaining high morale among the men and keeping Islanders informed of news of the service, the "Weekly Log" later developed into what was generally recognized throughout the service as one of the better service magazines in the country.

A Welfare Office enterprise, the station paper had six editors at its helm and these men were Tom Greene, Carol Phieffer, Burt Twilegar, Frank Costa, Jack Ayre and Maurice Kane.
