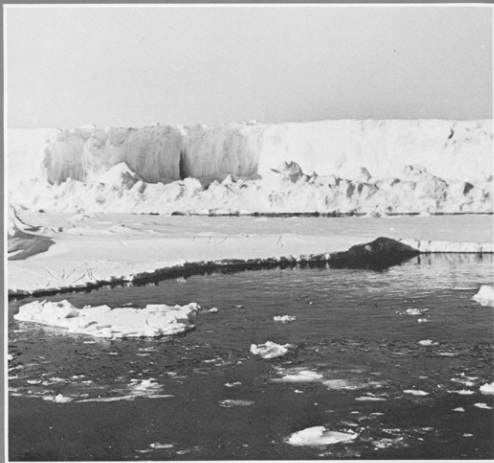


## DRYGALSKY ICE TONGUE



The most formidable feature we encountered was the Drygalski Ice Tongue, which we explored from 10 to 18 January. The tongue is a solid mass of ice that is eight miles wide and extends 36 miles into the Ross Sea from the East Victoria land coast. The top of the tongue is eighty feet above the water and we know that at least five times that much ice must be hidden below the water's surface.
