Atoll, Marshall Islands with 3248 passengers of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, and civilians enroute to Pearl Harbor, T. H. in company with escort Vessel USS BRACKETT (DE-41).

9 - 10 February, 1945 underway as before from Majuro Atoll, Marshall Islands enroute to Pearl Harbor, T. H.

1603 11 February, 1945 arrived at Pearl Harbor, T. H. and moored at dock A-13, Bishop Point.

12 February, 1945 moored as before disembarking small drafts of passengers, and embarking passengers.

0933 13 February, 1945 departed Pearl Harbor, T. H. with 3280 passengers of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and Civilians enroute to San Francisco, California.

14 - 17 February, 1945 underway as before from Pearl Harbor, T. H. enroute to San Francisco, California.

1101 18 February, 1945 arrived San Francisco, California and moored at U. S. Army Pier 7.

0910 20 - 1630 22 February, 1945 proceeded to Seattle, Washington for drydocking and annual overhaul.

3 March, 1945 held general muster at 1110 and Captain Lee H. Baker, U. S. Coast Guard transferred the command to Captain William J. Austermann, U. S. Coast Guard.

4 - 28 March, 1945 moored at Outfitting Dock, Puget Sound Bridge and Dredging Company. Ship being overhauled.

8 - 11 April, 1945 engaged in fueling ship, taking on stores, water and outbound passengers.
