

VOYAGE NUMBER ELEVEN

1800 29 August, 1945 departed San Francisco, California with 2884 passengers of the Army and American Red Cross enroute to Eniwetok Atoll, Marshall Islands.

30 August - 9 September, 1945 underway as before from San Francisco, California enroute to Eniwetok Atoll, Marshall Islands.

1515 10 September, 1945 arrived Eniwetok Atoll, Marshall Islands and anchored. 1712 departed Eniwetok Atoll, Marshall Islands enroute to San Pedro Bay, Leyte Island, Philippine Islands.

11 - 15 September, 1945 underway as before from Eniwetok Atoll, Marshall Islands enroute to San Pedro Bay, Leyte Island, Philippine Islands.

1634 16 September, 1945 arrived San Pedro Bay and anchored.

0714 18 September, 1945 departed San Pedro Bay, Leyte Island, Philippine Islands enroute to Batangas, Luzon Island, Philippine Islands.

1815 19 September, 1945 arrived Batangas, Luzon Island, Philippine Islands and anchored.

20 - 22 September, 1945 anchored as before. Disembarking.

0050 23 September, 1945 departed Batangas, Luzon Island, Philippine Islands enroute to Manila. 0842 arrived Manila and anchored.

24 - 26 September, 1945 embarked passenger personnel.

1906 27 September, 1945 departed Manila with 2882 passengers of the Army, Allied Armed Forces, American Red Cross, American and Allied Civilians. (Many of these passengers liberated prisoners.) Enroute to San Pedro Bay, Leyte Island, Philippine Islands.

1113 29 September, 1945 arrived San Pedro Bay and anchored. 1523 departed San Pedro Bay, Leyte Island, Philippine Islands enroute to San Francisco, California.

1045 15 October, 1945 arrived San Francisco, California and anchored.

16 October - 8 November, 1945 engaged in disembarking passengers, fueling ship, taking on stores, water and passengers.

VOYAGE NUMBER TWELVE

1647 9 November, 1945 departed San Fran-

cisco, California with 440 passengers of the Army and Civilians enroute to San Fernando, Luzon Island, Philippine Islands.

10 - 25 November, 1945 underway as before from San Francisco, California enroute to San Fernando, Luzon Island, Philippine Islands.

0803 26 November, 1945 arrived San Fernando, Luzon Island, Philippine Islands and moored at Pier 2, Berth 4. 1110 - 1235 disembarked passenger personnel. 1500 - 2250 embarked passenger personnel.

1700 27 November, 1945, departed San Fernando, Luzon Island, Philippine Islands, with 3,198 passengers of the Army enroute to San Pedro Bay, Leyte Island, Philippine Islands.

28 November, 1945 underway as before from San Francisco, California, enroute to San Pedro Bay, Leyte Island, Philippine Islands.

1450 29 November, 1945 arrived San Pedro Bay, Leyte Island, Philippine Islands. 1600 - 1630 embarked passenger personnel.

1350 30 November, 1945 departed San Pedro Bay, Leyte Island, Philippine Islands, with 3,273 passengers of the Army enroute to San Pedro, California.

1 - 14 December, 1945 underway as before from San Pedro Bay, Leyte Island, Philippine Islands, enroute to San Pedro, California.

1759 15 December, 1945 arrived San Pedro, California.

16 December, 1945 - 9 January, 1946 engaged in disembarking passengers, fueling ship, undergoing voyage repairs, taking on stores, water and outbound passengers. Captain William J. Austermann, U. S. Coast Guard, transferred the command to Commander George Bowerman, U. S. Coast Guard.

VOYAGE NUMBER THIRTEEN

1727 10 January, 1946 departed San Pedro, California with 3400 German Prisoners of War enroute to Liverpool, England via the Panama Canal.

11 - 17 January, 1946 underway as before from San Pedro, California enroute to Liverpool, England.

0842 18 January, 1946 arrived Balboa, Panama Canal Zone.

0913 18 January, 1946 departed Balboa,
