Millions Saved in Fire Losses

As everyone knows, Port Security operations of the Coast Guard in Boston and elsewhere resulted in huge savings from fire loss. But few of the Regulars and Temporary Reservists responsible for this prevention know what these savings amounted to during the war years.

Here is a wartime statement from USCG public relations which reveals a saving in a single year of over \$5,000,000 at one port:

"According to the Maritime Association of the Port of New York, fire insurance losses for which claims were paid June 18, 1940 to June 17, 1941 reached a total of \$5,045,341.65.

"For the same period June 18, 1942 to June 17, 1943 the losses for which claims were paid totaled only \$450.00.
